


The Need for the Nurse Licensure Compact

- Antiquated 100 yr old system of 1 license for 1 state
- Has not kept pace with technology and mobility
- Expansion of telehealth
- Avoid a federal solution to the problem
- Fix the problem of multiple licenses, duplicative regulation, unlicensed practice

What is the Nurse Licensure Compact?	
	An interstate licensure compact It allows a nurse to have one multistate license (in primary state of residency) This permits the nurse to practice in other member states (both physically and via telecommunications) subject to each state's practice laws









NLC Benefits Telehealth

- Nurses can practice in multiple states with one
- Increases patient access to care
- Enables care continuity for patients regardless of their location

The Future of the NLC

- Technology and therefore telehealth will continue to grow
- NLC will be adopted in all states that don't have political impediments; i.e., 85-90%.
- Nurses will voice their opinions in hold-out states





Primary Challenges Faced by States

- Lawmakers lack of understanding of interstate compact law; need for education (technical assistance)
- Rulemaking by the States vs. by the Commission
- New Requirement for Criminal Background Checks
- Lack of Support from Collective Bargaining Units
- Financial
